In compliance with the California State Liquor Laws, we must have an Officer of the Day at the door, and all guests of DWYC members must be signed in by the member with our "Swipeon" system before entrance. All visiting yacht club members must present verification, sign in with "Swipeon" and must wear a guest badge, printed by the "Swipeon" system. The OD must verify individuals, by requesting them to present their current membership card. Most members have their cards ready as they enter.*

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



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

The DWYC Seamen would like to thank all of those who participated in our events this year. We look forward to another fun filled year with some new and exciting events.

We have decided to venture south of the border for our next tasting to try some nice sipping tequila. Before you panic, this won't be the worm on the bottom tequila you got sick on in college. This will be the good stuff. We're looking to plan a dinner event with a Mexican theme and taste a range of tequilas from blanco to anejo. We're hoping to schedule something at the beginning of the year, so keep watch for the details. I will warn you, our last few events have sold out VERY quickly so act fast if you want to combine Seamen and Tequila.

Now a quick update on the first ever bourbon barrel the Seamen have ordered. One of the benefits of purchasing your own barrel is you are able to keep the actual oak barrel the bourbon was aged in, choose a custom label and bottle neck hanger and of course, drink it! The Seamen let their creative juices flow and we came up with some great label ideas, but you'll have to wait and see which label was actually chosen. As a teaser, I'll let you know the label that almost got selected, but due to government regulations and restrictions we were unable to use it. To begin, I need to clarify and define this word: "bunghole". A bunghole is a hole bored in a liquid-tight barrel to remove the contents. The hole is capped with a large cork-like object called a bung. Those of you familiar with the wine industry, will have probably heard this term and even had a sample of wine using a "thief" from the bunghole. When distilling bourbon, there is also a bunghole in each oak barrel. When ready to bottle, the barrel contents are emptied from the bunghole and prepared for bottling. Now the label for the first ever barrel of bourbon ordered by the Seamen was almost, "From Our Bunghole to Your Lips." Again, due to government regulation and COVID-19 restrictions, we had to change it. However, we had all the executives at Garrison Brothers in Texas laughing and they have officially come forward and said both our labels, the reject and the one we used, are by far the best they have ever had. The owner actually wanted to buy one of our bottles just so he could have one with our label. He'll have to wait until next time because we're sold out!

Thanks again for helping us get through these tough times while still staying safe and having some fun. We're looking forward to a great 2021 and many more good times.
