

On that tragic September morning in 2001, the United States was forever changed. Among the approximately 3000 lives lost that day were 343 Firefighters. One can never be too safe on water and there are many coastal and offshore race events that require a percentage of crew members to have an SAS (Safety at Sea) certificate. It's a great time to take a class if you plan to participate in long distance races, including Newport to Ensenada.

Southern California Yachting Association (SCYA) is hosting a US Sailing Sanctioned International Offshore SAS Course with Hands-on Training, October 2 & 3 at California Yacht Club in Marina Del Rey. It may seem like a distance to travel, but this is one of the first opportunities to participate in an SAS class in over 18 months. This certificate can upgrade to an International certificate and is good for five years.

As a side note, if you took an Offshore Safety at Sea Course in 2019 or 2020 (either in-person or online) with the intention to upgrade to an International Offshore certificate but were not able to meet the 365 day requirement to complete the Hands-On Training course due to the COVID crisis, you have until the end of 2022 to take a Hands-On course.

Still looking to bang the corners on a race course? There are plenty of opportunities and the fall season is usually the perfect time of year to get out on the water. If you prefer to stay local, it's not too late to enter the Fall Series at DPYC

on regatta network.

If you prefer to go the distance, the 57th Little Ensenada Race, hosted by Southwestern Yacht Club, leaves San Diego harbor




What is your secret talent? I've just started painting watercolors.
