The OD must verify individuals, by requesting them to present their current membership card. Most members have their cards ready as they enter.

### FLEET CAPTAIN

The Fleet Captain is responsible for watching out over our fleet and planning and executing our cruising season at the club. Fleet Captains are appointed by the vote of the Board of Directors, and serve in the capacity of a Director. Fleet Captains are expected to attend the once monthly Board meetings and put the time in to plan and participate in our cruising season (other volunteers often assist in planning individual cruises). Interpersonal skills are necessary as you will have direct contact with members and other clubs. Fleet Captain is an excellent way to meet other members and utilize your boating skills. Fleet Captains serve for one-year.

The deadline for submitting the Candidate Forms for Directorship is September 19th, 2022 and the nominees will be posted at the club by October 1st.





### WHY GUESTS MUST SIGN IN AND WEAR NAME TAGS:

I know this is a rule that is sometimes frustrating for some, but there are specific and practical reasons for requiring bonafide guests to sign in and wear a name tag.

The club operates under a private club liquor license, which authorizes the following:

"Authorizes the sale of beer, wine and distilled spirits, to members and guests only, for consumption on the premises where sold. No off-sale privileges. Food service is not required. Minors are allowed on the premises." (ABC web site).

In accordance with ABC recommendations, the club allows sponsored guests who sign in at the front. These guests are required to wear provided name tags where they are easily seen by staff and officers. The sign-in books are kept as evidence of compliance in the event of an inspection by ABC. The name tags confirm to the staff and others that the guest has, in fact, signed in. We can't expect the staff to run over and check the book when a non-member requests service. The number of guests may occasionally be limited to allow priority for access to members.

This is a small inconvenience. Let's all put on our big kid pants and continue to make it work and to ensure that DWYC keeps it's liquor license.




## **BOOK CLUB**
