


We have so many great cruising opportunities in the works! The end of April brought the Balboa cruise. Thank you to the Sicards, Riggses and Agas for help in hosting!





Did you have a nickname growing up or now? Charley Tuna. It seemed like the ad campaign for tuna fish evolved when I was a youngster and my friends started calling me that.



What is your secret talent? Escaping the honeydo list!


What are your hobbies? I am an avid tennis player. I play singles every morning at 7 a.m. at Braemar Country Club in Tarzana.

COAST GUARD AUXILIARY PUBLIC EDUCATION CLASSES

As you are aware, we have been unable to hold in-person classes due to COVID and we don't see that changing anytime soon. So, we will be putting on video classes using Zoom for the time being.

The first class will be **Suddenly in Command**, a course designed for people with limited boating experience who may have to take command of the boat in the event the skipper/operator is incapacitated. The purpose of this class is to help you take charge, assess the situation, protect the boat and crew, deal with any emergencies and seek help if needed. We have found that this is very helpful for younger boaters as well. The cost of the class is \$20. However, if you are 16 or younger, there is no charge.

It will take place on Tuesday May 11th at 7:00pm and end no later than 9:00pm.

The next class will be on how to use a VHF Marine radio on **Tuesday May 18**th at 7:00pm, ending by 9:00pm. Your VHF marina radio is one of the most important safety tools on your boat and you will learn how to make emergency calls, contact other vessels, get weather information and how to operate a radio among other subjects. Cost is \$20 per person.
