



JUNIOR'S CORNER

The Board is excited to announce that the Junior Program is expanding! Starting with our Winter/Spring 2022 Program (January 17th – May 27th), we will now have four different teams tailored to provide unique sailing experiences in different types of boats, including Club 420's, CFJ's, Tera's and Keel Boats (20'-40'). Teams will train on different days, so you will begin to see activity almost every day of the week.

The JSerra program is for High School level sailors to train in CFJ's, with additional access to Club 420's for advanced sailors. This competitive team will race in all top High School regattas.

The Offshore Program is a unique opportunity for our advanced Double Handed racers to begin their journey in learning to sail keel boats. In partnership with the Mariners Sea Scouts, DWYC is the first yacht club in Southern California to offer the opportunity for youth to explore the ocean more than a few miles offshore. Not only will our sailors be prepared to compete at the college level in CFJ's and C420's, but they will also learn the necessary skills (nautical, tactical, safety, crew) for broader recreational or competitive sailing.

In January, the Double Handed team competed in the 3rd race of the Perry Series (results not available at time of publication). The RS Tera team continues their quest to win the High Point Series at Santa Monica Wind Jammers Regatta and competes in the Midwinters North and South at Westlake and DPYC.

March 19th, we will be hosting our DWYC Sprint Tera Regatta and Spring Fundraiser.

Finally, summer camp dates are set for 2022 and are listed on our website. Once again, there are six 1-week sessions in June \mathcal{E} July. Registration will open in late March/early April. Look for more information in the next few Lines \mathcal{E} Bits.

We want to sincerely thank JrSC Hydee Riggs, Commodore Molly Dearing, VC Nina McNeely and Board of Directors for their support of the Juniors program. Without the ardent support of the Flags, Board and this passionate membership, we would not be in this position to build a strong, sustainable junior sailing program.


Steve and Patti Catanzaro enjoyed a week of skiing in Mammoth in January. Ski conditions and the weather

Remember to mark your calendars for our upcoming events. We look forward to making new friends this year and having lots of laughs! So, take that, COVID!





For those of you who may be a newer club member, a Silver Star is a former commodore also known as a Staff Commodore. We have had 43 Staff Commodores over the years, many of whom remain involved in the club.
